Competing interests

According to the International Committee of Medical Journal Editors <u>uniform declaration of competing interests</u>, editors, associate editors and authors should disclose four types of information:

Scandinavian Journal of Work, Environment & Health policy

When taking a decision on a manuscript, *Scandinavian Journal of Work, Environment & Health* editors and reviewers should know about the competing interests of the authors. A paper is not rejected due to a competing interest but it must be publicly declared.

When professional judgement concerning a primary interest (ie, validity of research) could be influenced by a secondary interest (ie, a financial interest), a competing interest exists. Perceptions of this conflict of interest are as important as the actual conflict of interest.

Possible competing interests include: board membership, consultancy, employment, expert testimony grants (including pending), contract research, lectures/other education events, speakers' bureaux, patents (planned, pending or issued), receipt of equipment or supplies, royalties, stock/stock options/other forms of ownership, additional expenses not included in COIs already specified, other personal or professional relationships that may influence or appear to influence.

All authors must declare their conflicts of interest as part of a summary of all authors of the manuscript when submitting to the Journal. In most cases only where there are competing interests will this be declared. The Journal will not necessarily always note where no interests are declared.
